### **ELIGIBILITY**

Applicants must;

- be Australian junior secondary level teachers of Y7-9 (teachers of Y5-6 and Y10 may apply) or New Zealand's junior secondary level teachers of Y9-11 (teachers of Y7-8 and Y12 may apply).
- be currently teaching Japanese a minimum of 3 hours per week.
- not be native or near-native Japanese speaker.
- be able to read Hiragana and Katakana without any difficulty.
- be at least JLPT N5 level of Japanese language proficiency.
