Participants will:

- develop language skills and increase confidence in using Japanese by working in an immersion environment.
- explore teaching ideas and strategies which they can then apply to their own classrooms in line with the Australian Curriculum.
- build new teacher networks, and share ideas and resources.

REQUIRED PARTICIPANT NUMBERS

Minimum of 10 applications as of November 15, 2021

Minimum of 10 participants as of December 6, 2021

Maximum of 24 participants (due to the COVID restrictions)

[NOTE] There is a chance that this seminar will be cancelled due to further COVID restrictions.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must:

- be an Australian teacher of primary levels K-Y6 (teachers of Y7-8 may apply) or a New Zealand teacher of primary levels Y1-8 (teachers of Y9-10 may apply).
- be currently teaching Japanese a minimum of 3 hours per week.
- not be a native or near-native Japanese speaker.
- be able to read Hiragana and Katakana without any difficulty.
- be at least JLPT N5 level of Japanese language proficiency.

PRIORITISATION OF APPLICATIONS

JPF Sydney will not enter into individual correspondence regarding the selection process and placement offers.
