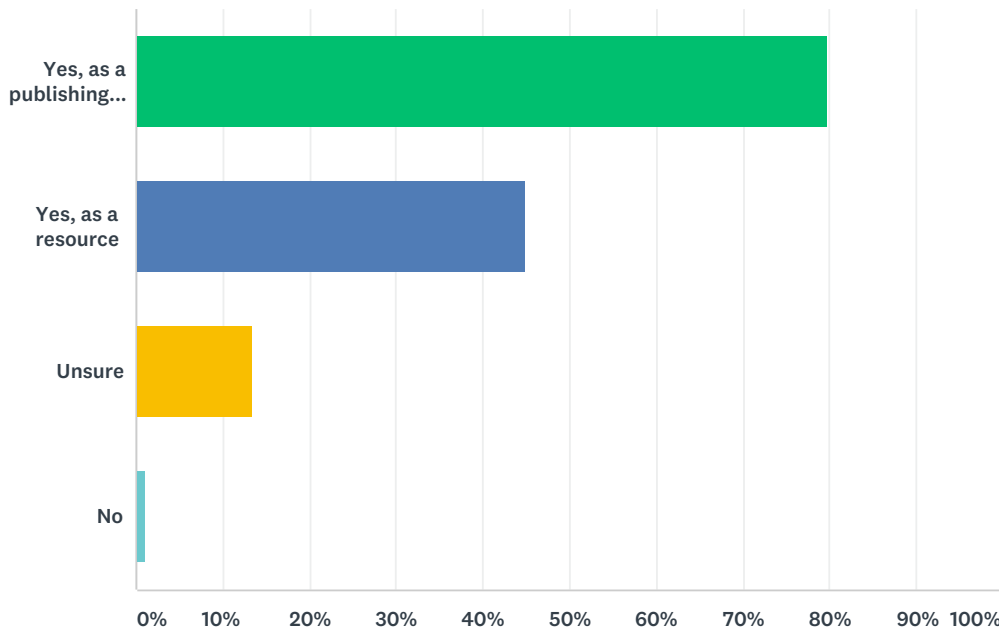


Q11 Would you recommend New Voices in Japanese Studies to a student or colleague? (Please check all that apply.)
